Entry criteria

Our Approach

- We believe that you should start courses at King Edward VI Sixth
 Form with at least a reasonable chance of success. The vast
 majority of our students will need to focus on successful
 completion of the equivalent of three courses across two years.
- As a general rule, students will be guided towards following course combinations dependent upon their GCSE results.
- Note: Some departments have higher individual subject requirements, established in the light of experience. These are shown in the course descriptions and we would strongly encourage you to use the teachers' experience and advice when deliberating over subject choices.



General Entry Requirements

Admission to Year 12 is subject to students meeting the following minimum entry requirements:

- 1. Gaining a minimum of **33** points from the student's 7 best GCSE results which must include English (Language and/or Literature) and Maths at Grade 4 or above.
- 2. Meeting each of the subject specific entry requirements that are outlined on each subject page. For example, students are also expected to have at least a grade 7 in GCSE Mathematics to study A level Mathematics.

A summary of all the entrance requirements for each subject can be found on page 21.

General Entry Requirements

Calculating your Point Score

- Points have the same numerical value as the grade achieved. For example, a Grade 5 is equivalent to 5 points.
- Combined Science GCSE counts as two GCSEs and the two grades should be combined. For example a 7/6 would be 13 points.
- For students who have studied other Level 2 equivalent courses the following conversions should be used:

Entry requirements

In addition to basic requirements, e.g.

- •Grade 6 in two sciences for Biology, Chemistry & Physics
- •Grade 6 in English Language & Literature for both courses
- •Two grades 6's in Science, 5 in English and Maths for Psychology
- •Recommend at least a 6 at GCSE in the subject you're taking

Oversubscription Criteria for External Applicants

King Edward VI Lichfield operates a waiting list process for Year 12 admissions in the event that the Year 12 admissions number is oversubscribed. Applicants who are placed on the waiting list will only be offered a place in Year 12 if places become available in the subjects chosen by the applicant. Places will be allocated in accordance with the oversubscription criteria:

- Looked After Children and previously Looked After Children (in public care)
- Students who live nearest to King Edward VI Lichfield (straight line distance measured from home to school)

In the event that individual subjects are oversubscribed following the admissions process, places will again be allocated for each subject based on the oversubscription criteria above.

Students who are unable to study a subject (due to oversubscription) will be offered the opportunity to discuss a possible alternative subject where available.



Consultation for Sixth Form Admission

Please be aware that there is a consultation in process for admission to the Sixth Form at King Edward VI School.

This is available via the school website and will run from Monday 6th November to Sunday 17th December 2023. This is due to the additional students already on roll at King Edward VI School in Year 11 and the limited capacity to offer Sixth Form places to external students. Children already in the school will not be required to apply formally for places in Year 12 but should have reached the minimum entry qualifications for admission into the sixth form, in addition to those for individual subjects, details of which are included in the prospectus.

We value the contribution that external students make to our Sixth Form, we are happy to offer places where they are available on courses. The proposed waiting list for external students will remain in operation until 4th September 2024.

Core Mathematical Studies
