Your child's report is now available on the GO 4 Schools (GO) website* and indicates how they are settling into their Key Stage 5 studies. It sits alongside the attendance, behaviour, and timetable information on the website, unfortunately it is not available on the app. Once on the webpage the report can be accessed via icons as shown on the left-hand side of this letter. Select 'Reports' and then click on the latest report.

Class teachers have provided a comment for each subject. In addition to the 'target grade' there is a 'projected grade'; this is based on the teacher's professional judgement and is the grade that is likely to be achieved in final examinations. The 'progress indicator' is a comparison between the 'projected grade' and the 'target grade'. New for this year you will also see a 'current grade', this is based on completed assessments and calculated by GO 4 Schools. At this early stage in Year 12, the current grade may only be based on one or two assessments, as the year progresses, and more assessments are completed the current grade will become more indicative of your child's performance.

The targets currently being provided are provisional and will be reviewed in the new year when further data becomes available from Fischer Family Trust (FFT), an independent non-profit organisation commissioned by the Department of Education. Based on the latest National Curriculum frameworks and standards, FFT provides estimates of potential individual performance based on how students of similar ability performed in their A-Level examinations nationally; similar ability is defined as similar prior attainment (i.e., GCSE Examination Results), gender and month of birth.

FFT provides us with subject specific estimates with three degrees of challenge; FFT 20% is used as the basis for our target setting, the estimates are based on progress seen in the top 20% of schools (high challenge). FFT also provides estimates based on grades achieved in 50% of schools (average challenge), and in the top 5% of schools (very high challenge). Many of our students achieve higher than their target.

In addition to your child's report being made available in the reporting section of GO, you will also now be able to access progress information on GO 4 Schools. This will include target, projected and current grades and a progress indicator. In addition to this, departments will start to make visible the grades achieved in assessments for their subjects. Initially you will be able to see an approach to learning rating (see table below) for each subject; good is the expectation and excellent the rating for those who exceed expectations.

It is important to note that the data that is made available and the timing of that information will be at the discretion of each department and dependent on departmental schemes of learning. Therefore, the publication of information will be different for each subject depending on how and when students are assessed. There are certain subjects / courses that lend themselves to more regular and shorter assessments, whilst others are based on larger and more infrequent projects, hence the volume of data will be different for each subject.

Target and projected grade information is available both online and via the app, but assessment data is only available online. This is determined by GO 4 Schools as an organisation and is not something that the school is able to change. To see assessment data, sign into your online account, click on 'Progress' and then under 'Grades' select 'Detailed (all grades plus marksheet grades)', you will then see any grade information for subjects that your child has been studying that departments have made available under the 'Sheet summary' header.

Subject III Biology, (i)

Students will follow the AQA A Level Biology specification, and sit 3 external exams at the end of the two year course. Students will complete end of topic assessments during lesson time throughout the two years for all topics, as well as a formal trial exam in both Year 12 and Year 13. Each assessment is reviewed in lesson with specific targets set for students to complete to further their knowledge and understanding. A third formal assessment which focusses on the essay component of the course is also completed during Year 13 after receiving essay-preparation lessons. Information about the sequence of assessments can be found in the student's folders.















Please be aware that at certain times of the year, for example during the exams results period during the summer and at the start of the academic year, progress information may not be visible whilst the system is being updated.

You will have an opportunity to speak to your child's teachers about their progress during an on-line parents' evening on **24**th **and 25**th **March.** In the meantime, if you have any queries, please contact their form tutor.
